Dear Friends,

On April 21st we officially kicked off our Centennial Capital Campaign with our "Get in the Game!" event. Good times were enjoyed even with Jeff Jennings pulling up old high school pictures of me and displaying for all to see.

As a church, we are committed to good stewardship as a faithful response to Christ's calling. We are working on a new loan agreement to help us move out of debt faster and smarter. The Centennial Campaign gives us the chance to chip away at the debt even more, and also gives us the chance to run the "race of faith" without the feeling of having concrete in our shoes.

The first thing we ask is that you pray. Pray that we are faithful to the calling to make disciples, to splinter the darkness, to be the light of Christ. The next thing we ask is that you prayerfully consider financially contributing to the campaign above your normal giving. Please read more about our event happening on May 5th.

The reason this is called the Centennial Campaign is because KUMC will celebrate her 100th year in 2017. We want to prepare for the next 100. We believe that aggressively addressing our debt is faithful stewardship and one of the ways to help us have a stable foundation for the next 105 years. We are so fortunate for the faithful servants who have made this church possible right up to this time and this place. Let's keep it going!



KUMC Explores New Financing



At the April 18th called charge conference, members heard about the research that has been conducted to secure a new loan package for our

church. Our consultant, Stewardship Innovations, received proposals from area banks and made a recommendation. At the conference, members voted to go with a new loan package that would more aggressively address our loan balance through monthly payments that tackle both the principal and interest. Our goal is to begin reducing the loan balance in an effective and methodical way. At press time, details were still being worked out with a possible closing date coming soon. All your children will be taught by the Lord, and they will have peace. Isaiah 54:13



fron Knights prepared about 150 hotdogs to feed the hungry masses, thanks to Tim Holmquist and his gas grill.

The Iron Knights served Brunswick stew, cheesy bread (yum) and salad at the April 2WeND. Thanks to the ladies for spearheading this event and the Iron Knights who attended. After the meal I was able to share a little history of the Iron Knights and provide insight into what we do. Last year the Iron Knights returned to the Church over \$13,000 and this year we could top over \$14,000. This is not possible without your support of our fund raisers throughout the year. The remaining Brunswick stew will be donated to the Food Pantry for distribution to the needy. Thank you Church family for your support!

At this writing final plans for the Chicken & BBQ plate sale are being made. I hope that you were able to join us as we strive to sell 900+ plates. Thanks to Nelson Edwards for negotiating a lower cost per plate than was originally quoted. Instead of a 25 cent increase per plate, the price will

remain the same as last year. Last year we broke the record for the number of plates sold which was 900 plates.
