In my studies this week I stumbled upon the passage listed above. I asked the same question I ask every day when I read through the Scriptures: "Jesus, why do you want me to read this passage today?"

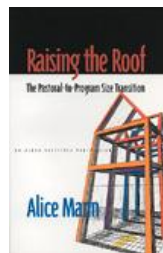
Interestingly, my mind returned to a book that I haven't read in years but was extremely powerful to me in my formative years. The book is *Heaven is a Playground* by Rick Telander. Telander spent a summer at some inner-city playground basketball courts in New York City getting to know the young men who day-after-day went there to escape the frustrations of the ghetto. Not only was basketball seen as a possible ticket out, but was a place to gather with friends and dream dreams (and all that was needed was a pair of sneakers and a passable jump shot). Some of the kids that Telander followed made it, some did not. As the book put it, "not only is heaven a playground, but it may be the only heaven some kids will ever know."

Why I think this came flooding back into my mind is this: No matter where we are from, or who we are, we are in search of "heaven", that place where dreams are dreamt and life is better. There are a lot of people who live near to our church who are looking for some escape, some reality that is greater than their topsy-turvy world. The answer for them, and for us, is this same Jesus who says "come to me" and offers us rest for our souls. Through his resurrection he offers a life that can be challenging, but a life that is "heaven."

Let us continue to find ways to bring the people needing "escape" to the wondrous

playground that is the Church where Christ Jesus is ready to give rest to weary souls and to challenge us to a life that breathes with the Spirit of God. May Knightdale United Methodist be a heavenly playground for many!

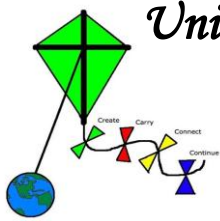
Raising the Roof Study

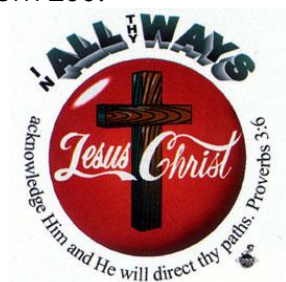

Eagle Scout Project



Can you remember back to how you spent your last Christmas holiday? I think we can all relate to the memories of family dinners, hanging ornaments on the tree, the anticipation of presents, and most importantly; time spent with family and loved ones. However, this past Christmas I experienced what it is like to spend Christmas without experiencing all the luxuries we all wait for. I spent my last Christmas in the Pediatric wing in Wake Med Hospital, undergoing major surgery. Nothing could fully prepare me for what I experienced; I felt pain, sadness, and at times I could not imagine anything that would make me smile again.

The next morning I awoke to see a basket of presents near my feet on the bed. For the first time in my life, I never even thought about what I would get for Christmas, but I was filled with joy once more, when my basket opened and I was given each of the gifts Wake Med provided through donations of citizens of Raleigh. I also recall the messages of comfort and happiness from people I had never met.

When I returned to Boy Scouts and rejoined my Troop, my Scout Master asked what I would like to do for my Eagle project. I knew I wanted to give back and share the feeling of warmth, happiness, and love to other children this Christmas. My project is to hold a toy drive for the children in the Pediatric wing at Wake Med Raleigh this Christmas.

My project will consist of three key phases to help make a difference in a child's Christmas:

- Collecting toys to be distributed early Christmas morning
- Making cards for the children to read or have read to them
- Wrapping the toys on the pediatric hospital floor so they are ready for distribution.

Boxes will be placed in the lobby of the cross during September and October, for donated items to be placed in. A wish list from Wake Med will be displayed near the boxes along with other information.

The items asked for are:

- ❖ Toys between \$5 and \$10.
- ❖ Toys must new
- ❖ Wake Med will choose for each patient

so gender, age, and equality are met.

- ❖ Toys for age's toddler through adolescent for about 40 patients.

My goal is to collect at least two hundred toys for the patients. There is no such thing as too many toys, any leftover toys will be used for kid's birthdays that still experience a hospital stay that is not during Christmas. We would like to ensure each child is presented with at least six to eight toys. As bills are often very expensive many children won't receive the toys from their families.

In addition to toys, my goal is to have a card with a message of hope, love, and joy to be provided to the children. Due to the diversity of cultures and religions, no religious or biblical illustrations, or messages are permitted. Though religion is not permitted in the cards, each card can be prayed over that it may be a blessing and a symbol of hope for each child. The cards may be created individually and given to any Pastor, Missions Leader, or myself.

The final step of the toy drive is wrapping. We will be looking for volunteers to help wrap gifts on December 18th at Wake Med. The wrapping will take place in the new visitor center, (Take elevator up to P4). The wrapping will be from 1-4 P.M. and may be split into two 1 ½ hour shifts. Due to space limitations only 5 people will be able to wrap at a time. People wanting to wrap should contact me, any pastor, or Missions leader. Watch for a sign-up sheet as it gets closer to that time. If another date is needed to meet the amount of toys collected, we will schedule an earlier Saturday to wrap.

This project is a personal one which will also fulfill my last requirement in becoming an Eagle Scout.

- **Your Hands:** Go to Jesus with open hands ready to be his hands in your congregation, community, nation, and world. Pray for God to give you the resources to do the work that needs to be done. Did You Know

In my travels throughout eastern North Carolina, I often encounter church congregations who worship their church buildings. One of the things I am most proud about here at Knightdale UMC is that we are not guilty of that sin. From the beginning, we have clearly

understood that this magnificent church complex on Forestville Road is a tool dedicated to fulfilling the mission and ministry of God is Eastern Wake County.

Yet, the task of providing this place where ministry happens daily is not inexpensive. For example, did you know:

- The single largest line item in this year's church budget is the mortgage interest payments – a cost of \$475 per day (\$173,000 for this year)
- Our electrical bill to provide lights, heating, and air conditioning is averaging \$2700 a month.
- Our outreach efforts continue to be strong – over \$30,000 given to missional giving so far this year, including \$3532 to the victims of the Haiti earthquake.

Pastor Bryan shared with the ALT at its August meeting that Christ comes to meet us where we are in life, and then transforms us into more than we were before. My prayer for all of us at Knightdale UMC is that we will collectively and individually be transformed with regards to the financial gifts we offer God from now through the end of the year. Did you ever give any money to God that you wished you could have taken back? I haven't....how about you?

DREAM COAT MISSION

On August 2nd KUMC submitted a Mission Seed Fund application to the NC Conference in Mission for the \$10,000 start-up cost to initiate the Dream Coat Mission. Sheila Prosser is the Project Coordinator. This is her God-given vision and now she wants to share her dream with others.

The Dream Coat Mission is envisioned to be an Outreach Store which will assist individuals and families in Eastern Wake County who have been devastated by disaster. The ministry will provide gently used clothing, furniture and

various household items to those impacted by personal tragedy to assist them in rebuilding their lives. A local storefront has been identified as a potential site for the mission that will also sell donated items at a modest price so it can become self-supporting. Other aspects for the mission include a shower and a washer and dryer to be made available to those in need. Opportunities to involve other outreach and care-giving ministries of the church to love our neighbor are also apparent when this mission becomes a reality.

Our Seed Fund Application cannot be approved at this time because the Conference has already allocated most of their money for 2010. However, we can resubmit in 2011 and have the advantage of already having a plan in place and document the progress realized toward making the Dream Coat Mission a reality.

Please pray about this new mission project initiative. If God is leading you to get involved, here are ways to help:

- A place is needed to store donated items until we can lease a storefront for the mission.
- The donation of a storefront or other appropriate property to house the mission would be a specific answer to prayer.
- Donations of gently used clothing, furniture and household items can be accepted in anticipation of opening the mission store. (No cash donations at this time please.)
- Involvement by those with gifts and talents pertinent to planning and operating a mission outreach store will be welcomed.
- A Dream Coat Mission Advisory Board is being formed. If you have experience in business or real estate or have connections to the local business community and a passion for mission please consider this service opportunity.

SURVEY OF KUMC MISSION PROJECTS

Let's Work Together for the Benefit of All A Message from the Trustees

The Trustee Committee is tasked with the responsibility of overseeing the Church buildings, its properties and all furnishings. With the completion of the new facility the responsibilities of the committee have increased many times over. Because of the many challenges that lay before us it has been our intention from the outset to set priorities and address these challenges in a timely fashion. However, at times, the sheer volume of issues at hand has been daunting. We have continued to move forward and have made progress on many of these items. From time to time,



unexpected issues have come before the Committee that required immediate attention and we have attempted to deal with these issues in a fair and timely fashion.

The Trustee's would like to make everyone aware that the future coffee bar area has been specifically set up for the consumption of food and beverages. There is a waste container in that area, which is marked for proper disposal of food and drink items. That container is designated to be emptied on a daily basis. The reason for this is to eliminate the possibility of having spoiling food in trash containers throughout the Church. We do not have a full time cleaning service, so there may be several days before all of the trash containers are emptied. In the meantime, we don't want the smell of spoiling food emanating from within the Church. Disposing of your containers in one location will minimize the likelihood of this happening. Please use this container for the disposal of your food and drink items and help us keep our Church odor free.

The Trustee's and Pastor Bryan Siefert would like to maintain the sanctity of the Lobby of the Cross and the Sanctuary, during Sunday worship. We are therefore asking that food and beverage not be taken into those areas during that time. The only exception is for those persons, who bring water containers, with lids, into the Sanctuary. Also, we recognize that the parents of infants need to have bottles and the like ready for their children. Blood Pressure Screenings
